Does the new language modify the current process for using DNRs internal to LG&E/KU to serve load inside LG&E/KU? Specifically does the language change modify the process for scheduling the [Transmission Customer] Peaking Plant to [Transmission Customer] load?	The redlined language was not intended to change the process for scheduling DNRs internal to LG&E/KU to serve loads inside LG&E/KU. Section 4.1 has been reworded to remove ambiguity.
On page 5 paragraph 1, [Transmission Customer] does not feel 10 business days is sufficient for a notice period. [Transmission Customer] believes this should be 30 calendar days at a minimum, and another notification not including posting on OASIS should be sent out by all affected parties.	The TO has given consideration to the Transmission Customer's comment and agrees. The intent of the timing change was to expedite the review process, particularly since most changes to the Business Practices are minor. LG&E/KU will reverse the timing changes. Additionally, LG&E/KU will provide notice via the OATT Notification exploder list when the LG&E/KU Business Practices document is available for review. However, it is up to individuals with each Transmission Customer to request to be added to this exploder list.
