Policy Reference

PacifiCorp's Open Access Transmission Tariff ("OATT"), Part II- Point-To-Point Transmission Service, 17.4- Notice of Deficient Application.

Definitions

No definitions other than those currently contained in the OATT are required for this business practice.

Purpose

The purpose of this business practice is to clarify the timeframe allowed for an Eligible Customer requesting service to remedy a deficient Application for Firm Point-To-Point Transmission Service and the Transmission Provider's notification in its Open Access Same-Time Information System ("OASIS") if efforts to remedy the deficiencies are unsuccessful.

This business practice applies to all Firm Point-To-Point Customers unless explicitly contradicted by contract terms.

Practice

Pursuant to Section 17.4 of PacifiCorp's OATT (including any required deposit), PacifiCorp shall notify an Eligible Customer within fifteen (15) days of the later of (1) the Transmission Customer's OASIS posting or (2) the Transmission Customer's written application of the reasons for such failure. PacifiCorp will allow the Eligible Customer thirty (30) days from the Transmission Provider's initial notification of a deficient Application to remedy deficiencies in its Application. If the Eligible Customer fails to remedy the deficiencies or has indicated that it is no longer interested in proceeding with the transmission request, Transmission Provider shall return the Application along with any deposit and interest to the Eligible Customer. In addition, Transmission Provider will ask that the Transmission Customer withdraw its transmission request in OASIS. If Transmission Customer fails to withdraw the transmission request in OASIS, Transmission Provider will add a note in the Seller_Comments field stating "Final state incomplete application per business practice." The transmission request will remain in OASIS unless it is withdrawn by the Transmission Customer; however, Transmission Provider will consider it to be in a final state.
