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FERC 890 Related BUSINESS PRACTICES GENERAL INFORMATION

Effective July 13, 2007

FERC Order 890 requires each Transmission provider to provide a means to designate and undesignate network resources (DNR) on a day-ahead basis. See FERC Order 890 (Docket Nos. RM05-17-000 and RM05-25-000 paragraph 90 and 385). This procedure addresses the DNR requirements stipulated in Order 890. Until NAESB provides direction to the OASIS vendors, this procedure will be utilized to meet the DNR requirements.

Designated Network Resource (DNR) Procedures

All DNR's must be designated on the OASIS for all network customers. The list of DNR's must include the following:

1. The resource name.
2. Geographic location.
3. Electrical location.
4. Amount of capacity designated.
5. A statement that attests that the resource meets the requirement of Section 30.1 and 30.7 of the pro forma OATT. The statement for each network resource must include that the resources are either

- 1) owned or, there is a commitment to purchase the designated network resource, and
- 2) the designated network resource comports with the requirements for designated network resources.

Prior to July 13th, 2007 each network customer must submit via a fax and an email to Doug Reese (dreese@tristategt.org) the initial list of DNR's in conformance with the above requirements. In accordance with FERC Order 890, these DNR's will be posted on the Tri-State OASIS.

Beginning on July 13th, 2007, in accordance with Order 890, paragraph 1543, a network customer may un-designate or designate resources utilizing the facsimile forms located in the **FERC Orders/FERC Order 890** folder on the Tri-State OASIS home page. The temporary DNR designation(s) must be submitted by 10:00 am Mountain Prevailing Time (MPT) on the WECC pre-scheduling day before the start (or end) of the change in resource designation. Transmission rollover rights for resources that are undesignated will be maintained for transmission reservations with a 5- year or more term. The term of any temporary DNR shall not be less than one day and shall begin at 12 midnight MPT and end at midnight MPT.

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DNR designations and designation changes will be verified via a phone call and those that cannot be verified or those that are found to be deficient will be returned to the sending fax with an explanation of the nature of the deficiency.

Approval of DNR designations and designation changes will be communicated via a fax to the sending fax number.

Network transmission requests associated with the designation of new resources shall be made on the Tri-State OASIS and must state “on-system DNR” or “off-system DNR” in the comments section of the network transmission service request.

DNR Procedures Are Subject To Change

This policy may be modified as needed as Order 890 issues are addressed.
