

Southeastern Regional Transmission Planning Group TVA Membership Background and History - Note to OASIS

As a component of its voluntary response to FERC Order 890 of February 16, 2007, the Tennessee Valley Authority (TVA) led the formation of the Central Public Power Partners (CPPP). The CPPP membership included TVA, East Kentucky Power Cooperative, Big Rivers Electric Corporation, and Associated Electric Cooperative, Inc. All four companies were part of the TVA Reliability Coordination Area.

The CPPP stakeholder group was formed to facilitate input to regional and inter-regional transmission planning studies; to provide a process for identifying and requesting economic planning studies; and to facilitate stakeholder access to planning data, assumptions, criteria, and results of studies. This stakeholder involvement process was intended to result in improved regional planning and to voluntarily address the requirement for open, transparent planning as described in the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission Order 890.

CPPP activities continued until the implementation of FERC Order 1000 in July 21, 2011. TVA's continuing voluntary response to FERC Order 890 and its voluntary response to FERC Order 1000 is now achieved through participation in SERTP.
